# Faculty of Clinical and Biomedical Sciences



## Studying Medicine



UCLan's Medical School, offers medical training to the highest UK standards. Students will benefit from a state-of-the-art curriculum and facilities which include high-specification clinical skills labs, life-size human simulators, a Human Anatomy Resource and Learning Centre (where students learn about the workings of the human body) and simulated care

settings, such as a GP surgery and patient's home setting. The MBBS programme offers places to a small cohort of students, with one of the major benefits being the early patient contact from Year 1. Students who are successful on the Medicine UFP and at the MBBS interview may be able to progress to the five-year MBBS at UCLan. A limited number of interview places are available for the MBBS programme. In order to shortlist applicants for interview the School of Medicine may use an additional aptitude test as part of the shortlisting process.

## Studying Pharmacy and Biomedical Sciences



The School enjoys a vibrant research culture focused on a number of key areas that is supported by excellent research and teaching facilities that include a £250,000 refurbishment of the Pharmacy Practice Suite. Experienced practitioners, including biomedical scientists and hospital pharmacists

bring real-world experience of NHS practice to the course, and students will have regular contact with patients in the classroom to ensure you develop patient-centred care.



"The UK provided a good stepping stone for me before I entered medical school. During the **ONCAMPUS** programme we had patient/doctor preparations which gave us experience of how it would feel to diagnose patients. I've learned we need lots of skills to be a doctor; communication, confidence and empathy. The teachers at **ONCAMPUS** offered us all the help we needed to gain more knowledge. Studying in Preston gives us a balance as we can focus and study here and then at the weekend go to Manchester, which is only 40 minutes away. In doing the **ONCAMPUS** Medicine Foundation I definitely gained more knowledge and came out more fit to be a doctor than I was before."

Superb facilities include the Health Psychology Suite; Cognitive Psychology Complex; Brain Imaging Lab; Mirrored Observation Suite; and Sport & Exercise Psychology Laboratories. Outside the classroom students can get involved in educational trips, professional conferences, work experience schemes or publish research.

## Studying Science and Computing



The School of Forensic and Applied Sciences is one of the largest Schools of its kind in the world that cover a diverse range of subjects: forensic investigation, policing, criminal investigation, forensic chemistry, forensic genetics and biology.


STFSC offers a range of activities from UCLan Students' Union and sports clubs to instructor-led classes and individual areas. The Centre consists of seven activity areas.





### 2 Our Central Admissions team will review your application.

We will send you an offer letter which will list any outstanding conditions. We will remove any conditions that have already been met. If we think the course is not right for you, we will suggest an alternative. If we have any queries about your application, we will contact you for further information.

### 3 To accept your place on the course you will need to meet all the remaining conditions, including payment of the deposit/ registration fee or proof of government sponsorship. We can only confirm your place once all conditions have been met, although once the deposit is paid we will hold a place for you.

Please note that if you require a visa to study with us, you may need to provide additional evidence to comply with the visa regulations in the UK. These are the requirements of the government and not of **ONCAMPUS**. Your assistance in meeting these requirements is much appreciated.

### 4 Once you have paid your deposit and met all the conditions of offer, we will confirm your place and send you a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) or a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) if you do not need a CAS.

If you need a visa, you will need to use your CAS/CoE to support your visa application. Please note a CAS can only be issued three months before the start of the course.

### 5 We will send you pre-arrival information.

### 6 You will then need to apply for a visa if you require one to study in the UK. It is your responsibility to obtain a visa before you travel to join the course.

If you do not have a valid visa, you will not be able to join the course so please make sure you apply as soon as possible. You will need to pay at least the first term's tuition fees before you begin your programme of study at **ONCAMPUS**. You should arrive on the weekend before the arrival date; please check your CAS statement or CoE for further details. Manchester is the closest airport to **ONCAMPUS** UCLan. 

