The city of Coventry is welcoming, friendly and safe, and one of the most affordable in the UK. The compact single-site campus is right in the city centre.





CAMPUS LIFE

In the middle of the campus lies **The Hub** students' building. This purpose-built space is where students gather before, after or in-between lectures and tutorials for a spot of lunch, a quick coffee or just to log onto one of the open access computers to catch up on emails or check Facebook.

It's also the home of Coventry University Students' Union (CUSU) and has a student bar, performing arts space, 2D and 3D cinema and

a mini supermarket, among many other things. It really is 'The Hub' of life on campus.

The University Library is your complete learning resource and offers a range of environments spread across five floors. There is lots of provision for individual, silent and group study working, with open areas, bookable rooms and a Learning Lounge which provides a more relaxed group study area.

The Sport and Recreation Centre is located centrally on campus. It contains a recently refurbished fitness suite with

all manner of cardiovascular and resistance machines, dedicated free weights and a core and stretch area. There are two indoor sports halls that are available for students to book and get together with friends for a spot of basketball, indoor football, badminton, netball and much more.

LIVING IN COVENTRY

ACCOMMODATION

Living in **ONCAMPUS** accommodation ensures that you will have a safe, comfortable place to live, and that you will be housed with other **ONCAMPUS** students, which is a great opportunity to make friends!

All of our **ONCAMPUS** rooms are owned and managed either by the University or by professional accommodation providers, meaning we can offer an excellent choice depending on your requirements - from catered halls of residence that include 10 meals per week to self-catered halls or other accommodation options in desirable areas of the city and surrounding areas.

Most of the accommodation is on or within walking distance of the campus.

Rent for accommodation ranges from £160 for a standard bedroom with shared facilities, to £240 per week for a large studio room with private bathroom and kitchen.



SHERBOURNE HOUSE

Sherbourne House (owned and managed by AXO Student Living) is ideally situated for students at **ONCAMPUS** Coventry with the main Priory Campus, the Alan Berry building, the library and the Student Union just a 15-minute walk away. The city centre and Coventry's vibrant night life are within walking distance. Train and bus stations are also close by.

The property offers recently refurbished en-suite rooms in shared flats for between four and seven students or studio rooms, perfect for sharing with friends or choosing a room within a student flat.

Facilities include communal common room plus:

Priory Hall: catered | single room with workspace, desk, chair, wardrobe and wash basin | shared kitchen | laundry | TV room | Wi-Fi | 1 minute walk to **ONCAMPUS**





Who is this programme designed for?

This programme is designed to prepare international students, who have completed senior secondary education, for entry to undergraduate studies at Coventry University. If you successfully complete the IFP you can achieve progression on a suitable programme of undergraduate study at Coventry University. The IFP is set at level 3, which is equivalent to A level standard in the UK.

How long will I study for?




