



International Engineering Program

URI's International Engineering Program (IEP) is the Nation's first and most distinctive program to prepare engineers for the global marketplace, boasting a very high job placement for graduates. During the course of five years, IEP students earn two degrees simultaneously: a B.S. in an engineering discipline and a B.A. in German, Spanish, French, Italian or Chinese. In the fourth year of the program students spend a year abroad, where they study for six months at a partner university then hold a paid internship at a global engineering firm for the remainder of the year. URI students have interned at companies such as BMW, Hasbro, Kraft Foods, and Siemens, and often receive employment offers from their host companies.

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics estimates the number of engineers will rise by 10 percent by 2020, making engineering one of the fastest growing occupations in the United States. All five most lucrative majors for Generation Y are in engineering fields, according to PayScale. Forbes magazine says "competition for new science, technology, engineering and math talent is steep. That means while other recent grads fight for jobs, these students will likely field multiple offers."

Rhode Island is the smallest state in the U.S., but it is not short on history and attractions. Rhode Island has an excellent public transportation system that makes it simple to get to its many famous sites and attractions. Rhode Island Public Transportation Authority (RIPTA) has a bus stop at URI that can take you to Jamestown, Newport, Warwick, and Providence as well as a nearby Amtrak Service. RIPTA also provides FlexService, a reservation-based van service, that can take you to any destination within the FlexService area.

ONCAMPUS Rhode Island's Activities Coordinator will plan and organize events on campus and throughout the area, providing you with the opportunity to explore your surroundings. 

Who is this program designed for?

This program is designed to prepare international students who have completed senior secondary education for entry to year 2 (sophomore year) of a U.S. undergraduate degree program.

How long will I study for?

This program lasts one academic year. The year is divided into 2 semesters. You will take up to 29 hours of classroom-based study per week.

What will I study?

This program includes supplemental support and academic subject modules. English will be integrated into the teaching of academic subjects, and will be taught separately if you need additional support to develop your English.

ONCAMPUS Rhode Island has carefully selected its academic courses to ensure that you are working toward completing the general education requirements of URI. This ensures you the maximum flexibility when choosing your major later in your studies. Our experienced staff are there to help and guide you through this process.

How will I be assessed?

You will be assessed at regular intervals throughout the program to ensure you are making the progress required to successfully complete the program. Assessment methodologies are aligned to those you will experience in the university environment. They include project work, essays, presentations, and unseen examinations.

General Education Requirements

Not everyone who applies to university knows exactly what they want to study or has an ultimate career path in mind. That's why in the U.S., bachelor's degrees include a wide variety of courses, called General Studies or General Education.

During your first and second years, you'll take a variety of General Education courses and have the chance to find out what you do and don't like. This will also help to broaden your overall knowledge and help you prepare to be an engaged and informed citizen.

It also means that by the end of your second year, you'll have a clear idea about where your strengths and interests lie. So, you'll be much better placed to make an informed decision about what subject you'd like to specialize or 'major' in.

This mix of general and specialist knowledge is a unique feature to the U.S. education system and a real advantage of choosing to study a U.S. bachelor's degree.

At URI you need to achieve 40 credits of general education across four broad areas:

- ★ Build knowledge of diverse peoples and cultures and of the natural and physical world

- ★ Develop intellectual and interdisciplinary competencies for academic and lifelong learning through the following four outcomes:

- ★ Exercise individual and social responsibilities

- ★ Integrate and apply abilities and capacities developed under each of the 3 above areas, adapting them to new settings, questions, and responsibilities

Receive Offer

Within two working days, you will receive a response with either: (1) a conditional offer, (2) a request for more information, or (3) a notification that the application is under further review. Conditional offers will note any missing required documents.

- Send the completed Previous Study in the U.S. form and a copy of any previous or current visas and I-20 documents electronically to Admissions*.
- Collect proof of funds as detailed in the Financial Declaration, with any additional required forms and send electronically to Admissions.
- Fulfill any remaining conditions noted on your conditional offer letter.
- Pay the registration fee (\$300) and the deposit (\$2,200).

*These forms are required, and an acceptance letter will not be issued unless they are completed.

Acceptance Letter and I-20

- Once you meet all conditions of acceptance, a draft Acceptance Letter will be issued within two working days.
- Review the draft Acceptance Letter to make sure all information is correct and accurate and confirm the shipping address and recipient to which the original of the I-20 document should be sent.
- Once any amendments to the Acceptance Letter have been sent to the CEG Admissions team, or the Acceptance Letter is confirmed accurate with them, the student will be emailed an electronic copy of the I-20 within one week, which will be followed by the original document in the mail.

F-1 Student Visa Application

- Once you have received an electronic copy of your I-20, book a visa appointment at your local U.S. Embassy and collect all of the required documents.
- Follow the instructions from your local U.S. Embassy website to start your visa application.
- Students should ensure that they are prepared to answer questions relating to their chosen study program in the USA, their own educational background, their career intentions, and their reason(s) for choosing this particular course of study.

Arrival at ONCAMPUS Rhode Island

- A pre-arrival handbook, which includes important information for your course of study, and medical forms, will be sent along with the electronic copy of the I-20, and will help prepare students for their arrival in Rhode Island.
- Students will also receive a housing form that must be completed and sent to the SRSO.
- Students must provide arrival details to Admissions and should arrive by the day before the program start date.
- The first few days of the program are dedicated to an orientation delivered by both the **ONCAMPUS** Rhode Island and URI.

Preparing for your student visa interview

Should your application be successful and you are admitted to our program, your next step will be to apply for a student visa. As part of your visa application process, you will likely have to attend an in-person visa interview. Below are some tips on how to prepare for this.

Please note: We cannot guarantee a successful outcome to your visa interview. These tips are only meant to advise you on what you can expect during your visa interview.

Do attend: Failure to attend the interview may result in automatic refusal of your application.

Do answer: Always answer all questions fully and honestly.

Do think: Think in advance about your program, the documents you provided in your visa application, and your intended course of study. The Visa Official wants to know that you have given your course of study serious thought before choosing it.

Do speak English: The Visa Official will likely check your level of English, so always answer in English, not via an interpreter. Practice answers to potential questions, and be prepared for them.

Do ask: Ask for clarification if you do not understand a question, to make sure you are providing the information they want.

Documents to bring: Check the documents required by your specific embassy at: www.usembassy.gov

In general, students are asked to provide the following documentation:

- 1 Original I-20
- 2 Proof of payment of SEVIS fee
- 3 Completed DS-160 form (non-immigrant visa application)
- 4 Acceptance letter
- 5 Passport
- 6 Academic transcripts (with translations)
- 7 Financial evidence used for the I-20
- 8 Passport-sized photograph

Here are tips for some of the types of questions you may be asked:

Question type: General Information about you, your education, your choice to study in the U.S.

Tip: Show that you are a genuine student looking to further your education.

Make it clear that you plan to return to your home country after graduation. Give reasons for returning that are stronger than your reasons for remaining in the USA.

Question type: Intended Course: what you plan to study at ONCAMPUS Rhode Island, course dates, and program details.

Tip: Become familiar with the information on our website and/or brochure.

Bring a brochure with you to show the visa official.

Explain why you want to attend your particular program for study. If the consulate official believes you want to remain in the USA after your program, you may not receive a visa.

Explain how studying in the USA relates to your future professional career in your home country.

Question type: Financial circumstances: Who will be paying for your course? What are the fees?

Tip: Bring all required financial documents and anything else you have that supports your financial status.

If you have been awarded a scholarship, bring a certificate or proof of your award.

Question type: Living in the U.S.: Where the school is located, and housing.

Tip: Bring your housing confirmation.

Learn about our location and clearly describe where the school is located within Rhode Island.
