The Faculty prides itself on being industry facing and this is reflected in the access it provides to work placements, live projects and staff with experience in the cultural and creative industries.


The annual degree show is a Faculty-wide event to showcase and celebrate the work of graduating students from all three Schools. The event includes an industry night for potential employers.

Campus Life


