




Monterey Bay

Monterey Bay is centrally located on the coast of California, just two hours south of San Francisco, with Los Angeles and San Diego in easy reach. The bay itself, one of the world's largest marine-protected areas, is home to whales, deep sea angler fish, and, of course, the CSUMB mascot, the sea otter. The CSUMB campus is near pristine beaches, redwood forests, mountain ranges, and tide pools.

The CSUMB campus sits halfway between the Monterey Peninsula, which features the coastal communities of Pacific Grove, Monterey (California's first capital), Seaside, Carmel, and the Salinas Valley.

Who is this program designed for?

Our **ONCAMPUS** program is designed for students who have completed senior secondary education and is a freshman year equivalent (year one) providing entry to year 2, or sophomore year, of an undergraduate degree at California State University, Monterey Bay.

How long will I study?

This program lasts for one academic year. The year is divided into two semesters. You will take up to twenty-nine (29) hours of classroom-based study per week.

What will I study?

Our proven program has carefully selected its academic courses to make sure that you are working toward completing the general education requirements of California State University, Monterey Bay. This ensures you the maximum flexibility when choosing your major later in your studies.

This program also includes extra support classes. English will be integrated into the teaching of academic subjects, and will be taught separately if you need more support to develop your language skills.

How will I be assessed?

You will be assessed regularly throughout the program to make sure you are reaching the progress needed to successfully complete the program. Assessment methods are similar to those you will experience in the American university environment. They include project work, essays, presentations, and exams.



What you will study

Understanding the U.S. Education System

The U.S. Education System

In the United States, undergraduate (or bachelor's) degree students take classes in General Education before focusing on classes from their chosen major. A bachelor's degree typically takes 4 years to complete.

General Education Requirements

Not everyone who applies to a university knows exactly what they want to study or has a career goal in mind. That is why in the U.S., bachelor's degrees include a wide variety of courses, called General Studies or General Education. The purpose of these required General Education classes is to provide you with broad knowledge and to prepare you to be an engaged and informed citizen.

During your first and second years, you will take a variety of General Education courses giving you a chance to find out what you do and do not like. It also means that by the end of your second year, you will have a clearer idea about what your strengths and interests are. And so, you will be much better placed to choose a major that you will be happy with.

This mix of general and specialist knowledge is a unique feature of the U.S. educational system, and is a key advantage of choosing a U.S. bachelor's degree.

The U.S. education system is different from most, and General Education classes are a new concept to most people not from the United States. Think of them as core classes that everyone must take regardless of their chosen major. Getting them out of the way during Year 1 will allow you to focus on your major classes during years 2 through 4.



CSUMB’s school mascot is the Otter, named Monte Rey.

Otters play a very important role in the Monterey Bay ecosystem. They were once heavily hunted for their furs, which brought the otter population down to a dangerously low number of 50 in 1938. However, because of great conservation efforts, the Monterey Bay region now has more than 3,000 otters. You can usually see them hanging close to the shore when you visit the tourist areas, and you can definitely see them out in the water while doing water sports.

The Monterey Bay Aquarium has an active otter exhibit and a protective tide pool for wild otters to gather. Their live sea otter cam inspired Disney Pixar’s recent hit film, *Finding Dory*, when creating their sea otter “cuddle party.”



Optional Practical Training

Next Steps

1 APPLY

Please complete the **ONCAMPUS** Cal State Monterey Bay Application Form and send it to our Admissions team, along with electronic copies of the following:

- Academic Transcripts (and certified translations, if your transcripts are not in English)
- Copy of your passport information page
- Evidence of English language level

2 RECEIVE OFFER

Within two working days, you will receive a response of: (1) a conditional offer, (2) a request for more information, or (3) a notification that the application is under further review. Conditional offers will note any required documents that are missing.

- Send the completed Previous Study in the U.S. form and a copy of any previous or current visas and I-20 documents electronically to Admissions*.
- Collect proof of funds as detailed in the Financial Affidavit, with any other required forms and send electronically to Admissions.
- Fulfill any remaining conditions noted on your conditional offer letter.
- Pay the registration fee (\$300) and the deposit (\$2,200).

*These forms are required, and an acceptance letter will not be issued unless they are completed.

3 ACCEPTANCE LETTER AND I-20

- Once you meet all of the conditions of acceptance, a draft Acceptance Letter will be issued within two working days.
- Review the draft Acceptance Letter to make sure all information is correct and confirm the shipping address to which the original I-20 document should be sent.
- Once you have sent any amendments to the Acceptance Letter to the Admissions team, or the Acceptance Letter is confirmed as accurate with them, you will be emailed an electronic copy of the I-20 within one week, which will be followed by the original document in the mail.

4 F-1 STUDENT VISA APPLICATION

- Once you have received an electronic copy of your I-20, arrange for a visa appointment at your local U.S. Embassy or Consulate and collect all of the required documents.
- Follow the instructions from your local U.S. Embassy or Consulate website to start your visa application.
- You should be sure that you are prepared to answer questions relating to your chosen study program in the USA, your own educational background, your career intentions, and your reason(s) for choosing this particular course of study.

5 PREPARE FOR ARRIVAL AT CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, MONTEREY BAY

- A pre-arrival handbook, which includes important information for your course of study, and medical forms, will be sent along with the electronic copy of the I-20, and will help prepare you for your arrival in California.
- You will also receive a housing form that must be completed and sent back to the program staff.
- Students must give arrival details to Admissions and should arrive by the day before the program starts.

Preparing for your student visa interview

Should your application be successful and you are admitted to our program, your next step will be to apply for a student visa. As part of your visa application process, you will likely have to attend an in-person visa interview. Below are some tips on how to prepare for this.

Please note: We cannot guarantee a successful outcome to your visa interview. These tips are only meant to advise you on what you can expect during your visa interview.

Do attend: Failure to attend the interview may result in automatic refusal of your application.

Do answer: Always answer all questions fully and honestly.

Do think: Think in advance about your program, the documents you provided in your visa application, and your intended course of study. The Visa Official wants to know that you have given your course of study serious thought before choosing it.

Do speak English: The Visa Official will likely check your level of English, so always answer in English, not via an interpreter. Practice answers to potential questions, and be prepared for them.

Do ask: Ask for clarification if you do not understand a question, to make sure you are providing the information they want.

Documents to bring: Check the documents required by your specific embassy at: www.usembassy.gov

In general, students are asked to provide the following documentation:

- 1 Original I-20
- 2 Proof of payment of SEVIS fee
- 3 Completed DS-160 form (non-immigrant visa application)
- 4 Acceptance letter
- 5 Passport
- 6 Academic transcripts (with translations)
- 7 Financial evidence used for the I-20
- 8 Passport-sized photograph

HERE ARE TIPS FOR SOME OF THE TYPES OF QUESTIONS YOU MAY BE ASKED:

Type of question: General Information about you, your education, your choice to study in the U.S.

Tip: Show that you are a genuine student looking to further your education. Make it clear that you plan to return to your home country after graduation. Give reasons for returning that are stronger than your reasons for remaining in the USA.

Type of question: Intended Course: what you plan to study at ONCAMPUS Cal State Monterey Bay, course dates, and program details.

Tip: Become familiar with the information on our website and/or brochure.

Bring a brochure with you to show the visa official.

Explain why you want to attend your particular program for study. If the consulate official believes you want to remain in the USA after your program, you may not receive a visa.

Explain how studying in the USA relates to your future professional career in your home country.

Type of question: Financial circumstances: Who will be paying for your course? What are the fees?

Tip: Bring all required financial documents and anything else you have that supports your financial status.

If you have been awarded a scholarship, bring a certificate or proof of your award.

Type of question: Living in America: Where the school is located, and housing.

Tip: Bring your housing confirmation.

Learn about our location and clearly describe where the school is located within California.
