










Green Spaces



National Space Centre

The award-winning National Space Centre is the UK's most prominent museum and educational hub on the fields of space science and astronomy.

The Centre houses many exhibits of modern day space exploration including six interactive galleries, the UK's largest planetarium and a 42m high rocket tower. It has many upright rockets on show - some of which have been to space!

It's a great place to visit for the day for a unique experience and is only £9.33 + VAT for a student ticket.

King Richard III Visitor Centre

The King Richard III Visitor Centre tells the incredible story of the king under the car park, King Richard III.

Using beautiful story-telling techniques and cutting-edge interactive displays, here you can learn about Richard III's life and death, a huge part of British history.

Tickets are £10 for an annual pass meaning you can visit as many times as you want!
