Luxembourg Gardens

These beautiful gardens are an ideal place for a lovely walk in the warm Parisian weather. They were a royal building and grounds before the French revolution and now they are completely free to visit.

These gardens are Parisians and tourists favourite relaxation spot and is a lovely location for students to enjoy picnics and walks.





Petit Palais

This stunning art gallery is free to enter and allows students to see some amazing artwork from the French and Italian Renaissance era, ancient and medieval collections. Flemish and Dutch art collections and much more. Petit Palais is located near the Champs-Élysées.

Explore other cities

The Marseille campus is based at the Luminy campus nestled on the edge of the Calanques National Park. The Bordeaux campus is located on the Talence campus 30 minutes away from the city centre by tram and spread over 35,000m², the campus is designed to provide the most innovative facilities to meet students' needs.

Marseilles

Bordeaux

Home to more than 350 historic monuments, Bordeaux is a popular tourist destination with unrivalled architectural and cultural heritage. Known for its iconic vineyards and stunning château's, Bordeaux has plenty of sights and activities for students to explore.

Students studying in Bordeaux can take a 30 minute tram to visit the beautiful Bordeaux city centre and enjoy numerous music festivals, parks and gardens, vineyards and cultural sites.
