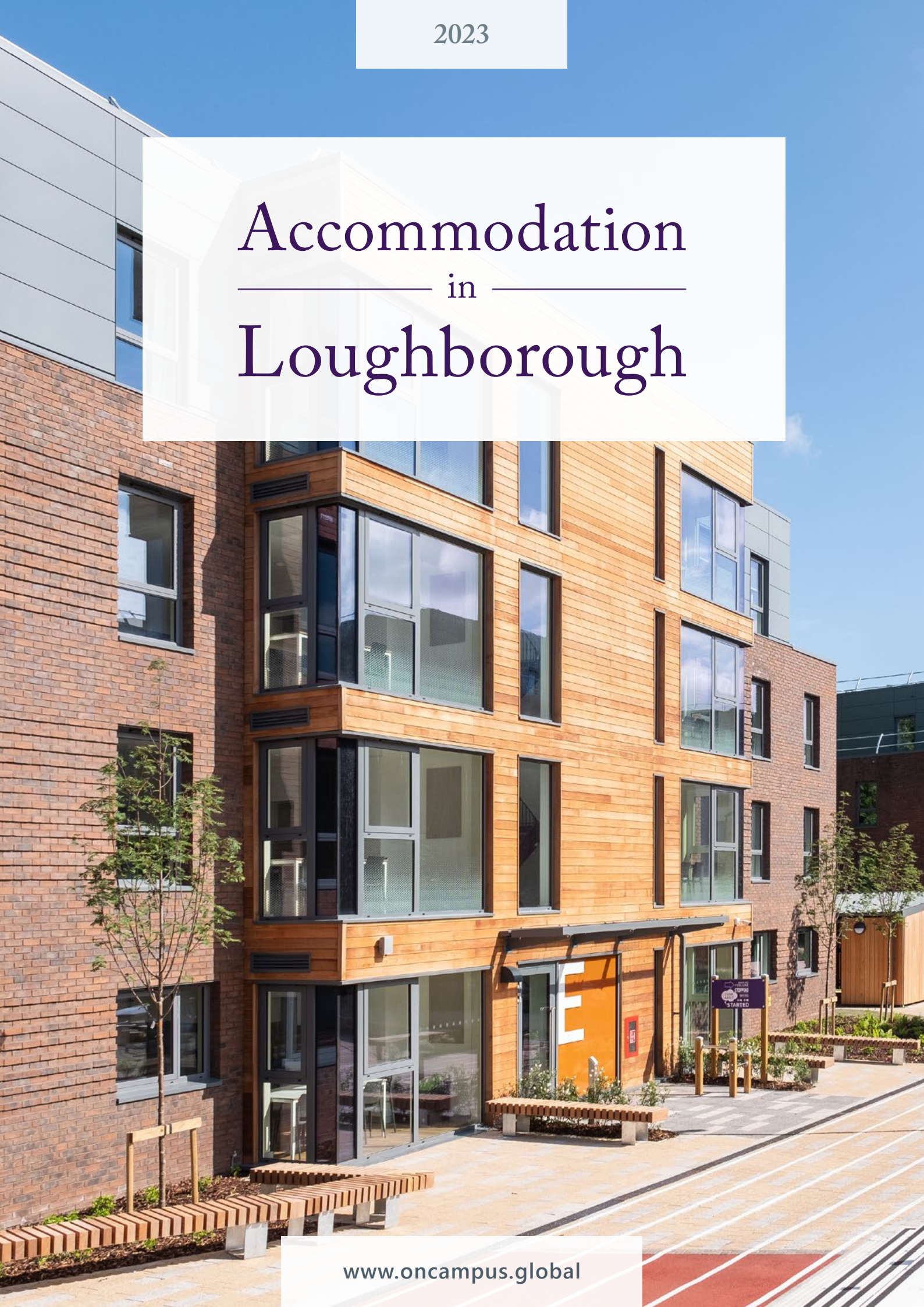

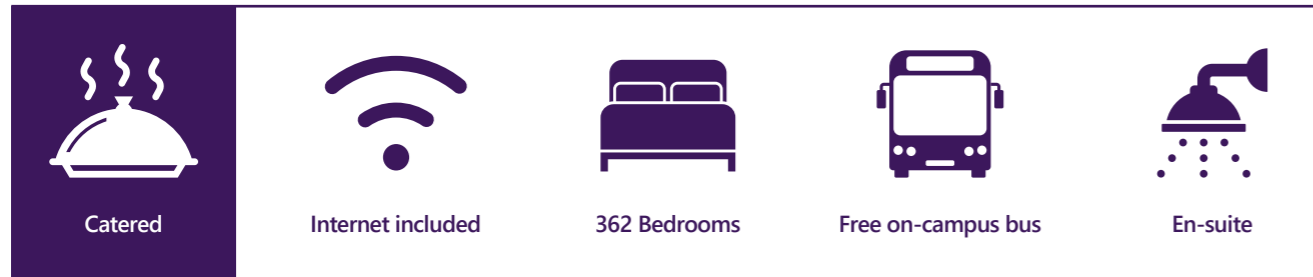

David Collett

David Collett is located in the west park on campus and is close to the Engineering departments and University Library. The hall offers spacious rooms located in six different blocks and is named after the Chairman of the University Council from 1966 to 1982.

- Bike shed



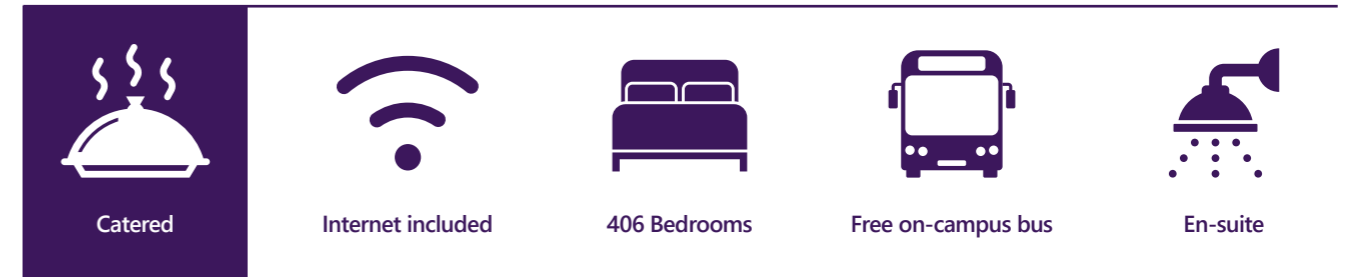

Elvyn Richards

Elvyn Richards is located in the popular student village. This hall takes its name from Professor Elvyn Richards, the University's second Vice-Chancellor from 1967 to 1975.

Faraday

Faraday is in the student village at the heart of the campus, consisting of 27 accommodation blocks of two and three storeys. This hall is named after the renowned scientist and former Director of the Royal Institution, Michael Faraday.

Royce

Located in the popular student village, Royce consists of 19 accommodation blocks of two and three storeys. It is close to lecture halls, sports facilities, the library and is only a 20-minute walk from town. The hall is named after Sir Henry Royce, founder member of Rolls-Royce Ltd, a pioneer of aeronautical engineering in education.

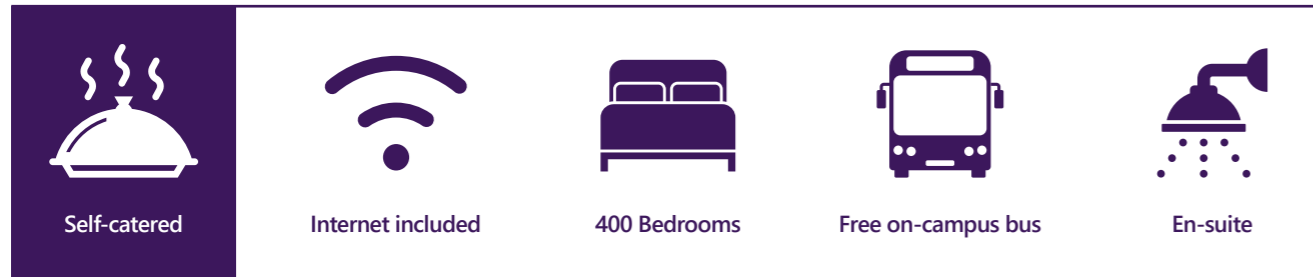

Robert Bakewell

Located in the student village, Robert Bakewell hall is only a 5-minute walk from the library, a 5-minute walk from the EHB bar and a 10-minute walk to the Students' Union. The hall is named after Robert Bakewell who was an eighteenth-century agriculturalist from nearby Dishley Grange.

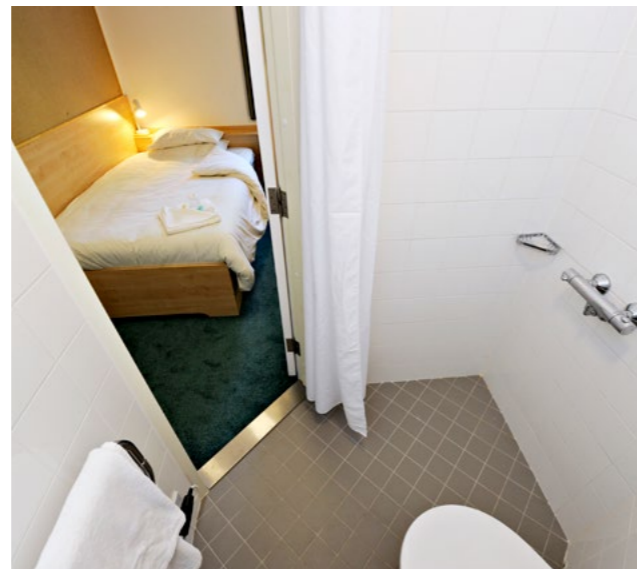

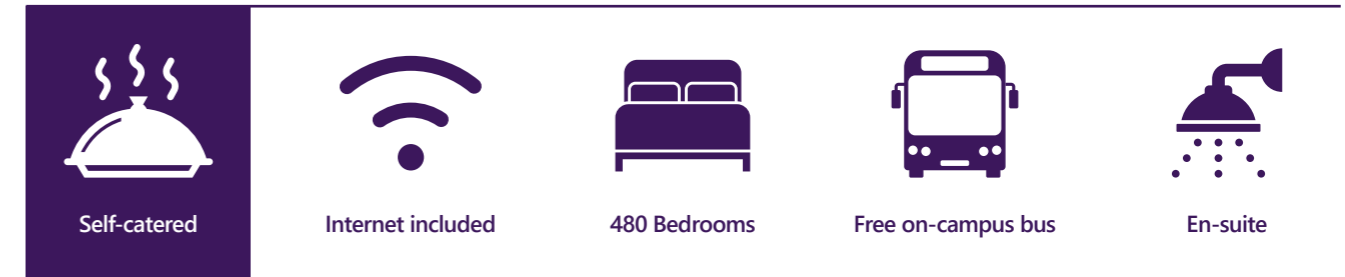

Claudia Parsons

Claudia Parsons is a new Hall of Residence opened in 2019 - this hall is named after an English engineer, traveller and Alumna of Loughborough University. She is known for being the first woman to circumnavigate the world by car. Located in the village, Claudia Parsons is at the heart of campus and close to lecture theatres, sporting facilities and the Students' Union.

Falkner Eggington

Named after Harold Everett Falkner, founder and former head of Aeronautical Engineering. Also Alfred Thomas Eggington, awarded the Military Cross in 1916, former headmaster of Loughborough College. Falkner Eggington is the largest self-catered hall on campus. With a unique mix of ages and cultures the hall is known for its community spirit and lively atmosphere.

How to apply

Once you have paid your course deposit, you will receive an email from the Student Accommodation Centre within three working days to advise you when and how to apply. Please add sac@lboro.ac.uk to your contacts to ensure you receive our emails.

Research

Please take a look at the halls to familiarise yourself with the different accommodation options available to you. If you will be under 18 at the time of entry, we strongly recommend you consider the catered hall options.

It is also important to read the occupancy Licence Terms and Conditions before you proceed.

Registration

You will need to register an account before you can log in for the first time. You will receive an email from sac@lboro.ac.uk shortly after you pay your course deposit containing a 6 digit number, use this as your Student ID for registering on Accommodation Hub. Once you have completed the short registration process, you will receive a confirmation email. You will then be able to proceed to the application stage.

Application

Once you have registered your account you will be able to log in and reserve your accommodation online. Once you have reserved your room, you will then automatically proceed to accept your Accommodation Contract. If you want to think about your offer, you can choose to Accept Later - we will hold your offer for 5 days for you to log back in to accept or reject it.

Accommodation Contract

In order to accept the contract online, you will be required to enter your accommodation username and password. You will be entering into a legally binding agreement with the University, your landlord.

Prior to arrival, we will contact you to complete our online Living in Halls induction and book an arrival slot.

Please contact the Student Accommodation Centre if you experience problems applying for your accommodation.

Confirmation and Payment

Once you receive an email titled 'Offer of accommodation accepted' from sac@lboro.ac.uk you have successfully reserved your room.

You can then check your licence details and room type on the Accommodation Hub.

We will confirm your room number shortly before you arrive.

Your first accommodation payment is required in October 2023. You will be contacted with further details.



If you are travelling to Heathrow Airport, we provide a free bus transfer.
